Phonics

The foundations for competent reading and writing are laid down from the age of three to seven. We know the importance of children developing their vocabulary, listening both to what others say and mean, and to the sounds of words. We know how to teach the recognition of letters and the association of sounds with letters and combinations of letters to decode and spell words.' – Christine Gilbert HMI 2010 Research At Southwick School, our phonics programme is delivered using 'Sounds Write', a method of learning letter sounds and blending them together to read and write words. Children work through the initial and extended code, learning and developing their phonemic knowledge in the process. Children have daily phonics lessons planned using the Sounds Write programme, which are matched to their developing needs. Teachers draw upon observations and continuous assessment to ensure children are stretched and challenged and to identify children who may need additional support, for whom additional phonics sessions are put into place. The children's phonemic knowledge is supported through the use of closely
matched texts which the children take home to share with their parents.
