

When parents are involved with their child's learning there is a significant impact on progress.

The following are some of the ways in which we try to help you to understand and engage with your child's education:

- Topic webs are sent home termly.
- Homework is set weekly.
- You are invited in to share children's learning at the end of most learning themes, maybe to view an art exhibition or a science demonstration in the classroom. Examples of each term's learning for each class can also be found on this website.
- KS1 parents are invited to take part in story times at the end of each Tuesday.
- KS2 parents are invited into classes at the beginning of the day to work alongside their child - please ask the class teachers for details.
- You are invited to acts of worship held in St Thomas' Church as well as to some school assemblies (please see the Parent Guide to Collective Acts of Worship for details).
- Written school reports are sent home in the spring term with an opportunity to discuss them offered.
- Parent evenings are held in the autumn and summer terms and we encourage you to bring your child along too.
- After school information evenings are held eg on phonics, and guides are sent home on, for example, how to help your child with calculation. All these can be found elsewhere on this website.
- This school website contains lots of useful information on all sorts of subjects such as E-Safety and Child Protection.
- You are always very welcome to come into school if you have any queries or concerns. Just check at the school office or with the class teacher to arrange a mutually convenient time.
